Dear Parishioners,

In this pamphlet, I am pleased to present plans to renovate both our parish church and parish centre.

The church and its campus holds pride of place on the Main Street of Bray and attests to the Catholic life of the parish in the town. Unfortunately, the church building and parish centre have become somewhat dilapidated in recent years.

A team from the parish, supported by a firm of Architects, has developed plans to carry out essential works required both to protect our two critical assets and restore them to a state that will sustain them into the future. Overleaf, you will find details of the refurbishment programme. Given the urgency, size and complexity of what is needed, the cost of renovating the two buildings is in excess of €1m.

Having recently been appointed to this parish, I am impressed by the careful preparation that has already been undertaken to financially support the project. I am glad to be able to say that the team has secured funding for a significant part of the required spend. However, there is still in excess €300k to be raised.

To facilitate this, the team has proposed a '1,000 Steps Initiative'. Each step is valued at €300 and the hope is that we as a community can complete the 1,000 steps over the next few months.

We would like you to talk to your family, your friends or any group that you belong to about taking at least one of the 1000 steps by organising a fundraiser - a cake sale, a coffee morning or indeed anything else you see fit. Some individuals or families may also want to simply donate the cost of one or more steps themselves. No matter what, all donations, large or small will be gratefully received.

New regulations about public buildings has added an urgency to the project. To allow us to carry out the renovations during the summer of next year, we need to complete our fundraising by Easter 2019. I invite you to complete the pledge form overleaf and return it as soon as possible to the parish office or sacristy, or simply place it in one of the boxes provided at the Church doors. We also plan to approach a small number of key benefactors for their support.

I very much appreciate there are many demands on your hard-earned money but hopefully you will see it in your heart to contribute generously to this very necessary and worthwhile project.
